**MICHAEL J. VANROOYEN, MD, MPH, FACEP**



Dr. Michael J. VanRooyen is a board-certified Emergency Medicine Physician with an interest in International Health. He serves as Director-in-Chief for the Division of International Health and Humanitarian Programs (DIHHP). He is also Co-Director of the Harvard Humanitarian Initiative, and is an Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. VanRooyen has worked extensively in disaster relief and humanitarian assistance internationally, including Bosnia, Rwanda, Somalia, Congo and Honduras. In 2004-2005, Dr. VanRooyen traveled with Physicians for Human Rights (PHR) to Sudan for investigation of health and human rights violations. He has considerable teaching experience in the field of disaster and humanitarian assistance and is widely published in this arena.

Prior to joining the Brigham and Women's Department of Emergency Medicine, Dr. VanRooyen served as Co-Director of the Center for International Emergency Disaster and Refugee Studies (CIEDRS) at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and was Vice-Chairman for the Department of Emergency Medicine at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. Dr. VanRooyen holds academic degrees from Michigan State University, Wayne State University, and the University of Illinois.
