Youth Summer Program

Program Overview

The Youth Summer Program is a summer exploration program that introduces students to the world of work and the dynamic careers in health care.

Through the Youth Summer Program experience, students:

- Gain self-awareness of his/her talents and career interests
- Develop positive work habits that will promote his/her success in the future
- Learn new skills, which can be brought back to the classroom
- Gain meaningful paid work experience

The BWH:

- Expands the hospital's teaching mission
- Enhances the hospital's diversity initiatives

Selection Process

The Youth Summer Program is open to students, who are at least 16 years of age, have a willingness to work at BWH and are available to work for the duration of the program. An application process is used to select students for the program. Students are screened by PIC, ABCD, RTH, Brookline and Winsor career specialists working at the high schools and then interviewed by BWH Human Resources staff. Selected students are hired as temporary employees of Human Resources and are to sign agreements in accordance with BWH policies, have a CORI check and provide documentation of immunizations required for working at a hospital.
