PASSAGEWAY works to improve the health, well-being and safety of those experiencing domestic violence.

To hospitals and health center **patients and employees**, we offer:

- Free and confidential advocacy services*
- Safety planning
- Individual counseling and support
- A safe place to talk
- Information about the health effects of domestic violence
- Support groups
- Medical advocacy
- Legal and court advocacy
- Referrals to community resources (health care, housing, shelter, lawyers, and others)

**Services are flexible and designed to create safe access for individuals. A person does NOT need to leave a relationship to use our services. We support a person's individual choices and rights.*

Domestic violence is a pattern of controlling and abusive behaviors that is harmful physically, emotionally and spiritually. Domestic violence is linked to many common health conditions, including anxiety and depression, physical injuries, chronic pain, gynecological disorders, stomach problems, migraines/headaches, and pregnancy complications. If you are being abused, there is caring support available to you where you work or get your health care.
