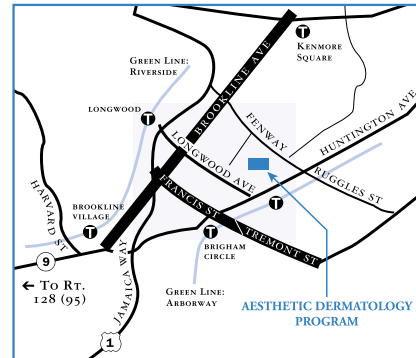


## DIRECTIONS TO 221 LONGWOOD AVENUE

**From the North:** Head south on Route 93. Take Storrow Drive West. Take the Fenway/Route 1 South exit (on left). At lights, bear right onto Boylston Street. At third set of lights, bear left onto Brookline Avenue. At fourth set of lights, turn left onto Longwood Avenue. 221 Longwood is on the left-hand side of the street.

**From the West:** Head east on Massachusetts Turnpike. Take Route 128 (I-95) South for approximately one mile. Take Route 9 East for six miles. Take a left onto Brookline Avenue (Brook House Condominiums will be on right). At fourth set of lights, turn right onto Longwood Avenue. ~or~ Stay on Massachusetts Turnpike East. Take Huntington Avenue/Copley Square/Prudential Center exit. Follow Huntington Avenue West for approximately three miles. Turn right onto Longwood Avenue. 221 Longwood is on the right-hand side of the street.

**From the South:** Head north on Route 3 (Southeast Expressway). Take the Massachusetts Avenue/Roxbury exit. At end of ramp, cross Massachusetts Avenue onto Melnea Cass Boulevard. At the eighth traffic light, take left onto Tremont Street. Take first right onto Ruggles Street. Turn left onto Huntington Avenue at intersection with Ruggles Street. Turn right onto Longwood Avenue. 221 Longwood is on the right-hand side of the street.



## PARKING

# The Brigham and Women's Hospital Aesthetic Dermatology Program

The Brigham and Women's Hospital Aesthetic Dermatology Program specializes in cosmetic dermatological procedures to enhance your appearance. We offer a complete range of services and treatments that can help maintain the health of your skin and improve its appearance.

The Aesthetic Dermatology Program is part of the Brigham and Women's Hospital Department of Dermatology, which treats all conditions and diseases of the skin. We are also part of one of the nation's leading hospitals and teaching affiliates of Harvard Medical School.

Our services begin with an initial consultation, when we discuss your concerns and goals and explore treatment options that are available to you. We will work with you to develop a treatment plan that meets your individual and very personal needs.

Our program offers a multitude of options for treatment of the many changes in the skin that are related to sun exposure and the natural aging process.

## Laser treatment

Using the most advanced technology, lasers are now being used for the treatment of vascular lesions, skin imperfections and unwanted hair, with great success.

During laser treatment, the laser-beam targets color in the skin lesion or hair follicle which absorbs the beam of highly concentrated light. For a very brief moment the laser pulses and, in effect, vaporizes the target. Over the course of treatments, the lesion is typically removed, lightened or hair growth is ceased.

Laser treatment is offered on an outpatient basis and does not require general anesthesia but, in some cases, topical anesthesia may be used.

## The Aesthetic Dermatology Program offers state-of-the-art methods for the laser treatment of:

- Broken capillaries of the face and nose (telangiectasias)
- Port wine stains and other vascular lesions
- Brown spots on the skin (lentigines)
- Wrinkles (rhytides)
- Tattoo removal
- Hair removal

## Caring for your skin

Proper skin care, including sunscreen, is important for your skin health on a daily basis. Our program also offers services that can help enhance and maintain the condition of your skin.

We can provide you with an overall assessment of your skin and offer suggestions for treatment options that may build upon your skin care regimen and improve and enhance your appearance.

## Skin care treatments include:

- Chemical peels and facials – a safe and effective way to improve the appearance and texture of your skin.
- Botox injections – an innovative treatment that assists in reducing wrinkles without surgery.
- Collagen injections – to improve fine lines, scars and enhance facial features.

## The program also provides:

- Sclerotherapy – a treatment using saline injections to eliminate spider veins on the legs.
