Positions are available on the Department of Dermatology NIH Training Grant for the upcoming funding period. Funding is available to begin July 1st for one year, with eligibility for renewal for a second year of funding. Candidates must be U.S. citizens or possess a Green Card, and should be committed to an academic career. Funding includes a stipend equivalent to the PGY level and \$1,000 travel funds. The 12-month period of funding will begin on the effective appointment date to the Training Grant.
