[NIH Announces New Tool for Grant Searches](#)

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) now has a web site where information is available about grants and funded research. The Research Portfolio Online Reporting Tool (RePORT) has a "user friendly system" called RePORT Expenditures and Results (RePORTER). [RePORTER](#) combines NIH project databases and funding records, PubMed abstracts, full-text articles from PubMed Central and information from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office with a robust search engine, allowing users to locate descriptions and funding details on NIH-funded projects along with research results that cite the NIH support. As of Tuesday, September 1, RePORTER replaced NIH's now-retired CRISP system.
