Topics covered include; fundamental strategies of analytical design; evaluating evidence used in presentations; statistical data: tables, graphics, and semi-graphics; business, scientific, research, and financial presentations; complexity and clarity; effective presentations: on paper and in person; interface design; use of PowerPoint, video, overheads, and handouts; animation and scientific visualizations. Edward Tufte has written seven books, including *Visual Explanations*, *Envisioning Information*, *The Visual Display of Quantitative Information*, and *Data Analysis for Politics and Policy*. Edward Tufte writes, designs, and self-publishes his books on analytical design, which have received more than 40 awards for content and design. He is Professor Emeritus at Yale University, where he taught courses in statistical evidence, information design, and interface design.
