Having problems pulling together the prose for your grant proposal?

The BWH Editorial Service can help you find a focus, organize the text, and express ideas clearly and concisely. For multiauthored proposals, the Editors will synthesize sections written by different investigators, establishing a consistent style and developing a coherent document.

Feeling pressure to finish your draft of a journal article, book chapter, monograph, or symposium paper?

Whatever your current writing project may be, the Editors will meet with you, at your convenience, to help you plan and organize your material. If you have a draft in hand, the staff will look it over carefully and offer suggestions to help you get to the next step. Typically, editorial input covers style, grammar, logic of argument, consistency and accuracy of content, and agreement between text and tables.

Struggling to write in English when it's not your native language?

The editorial staff is experienced at helping non-native English speakers with medical writing in English.
