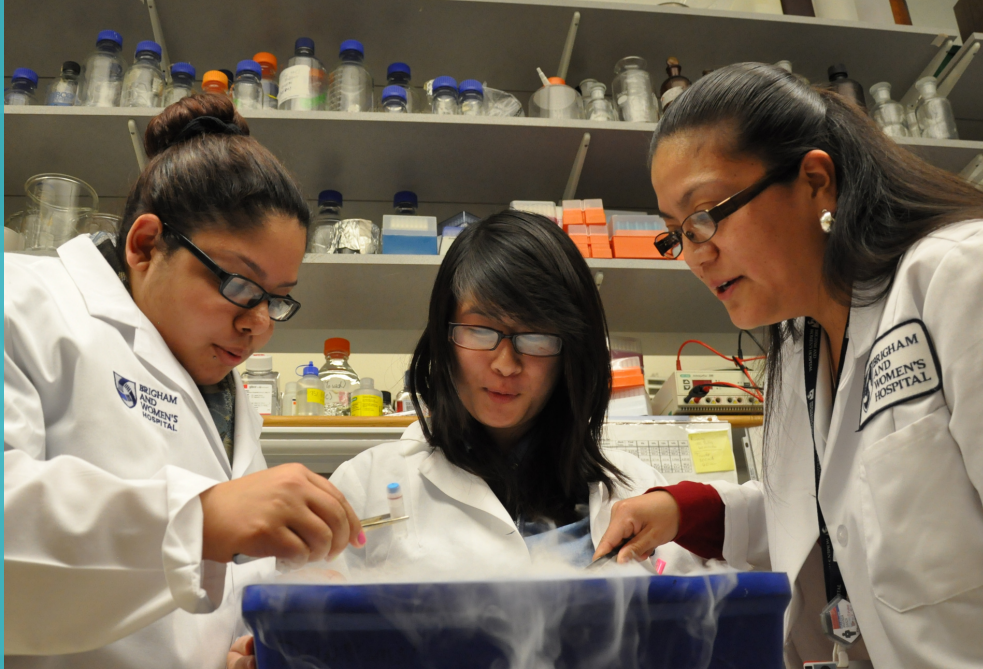

## PROJECT TEACH

Mentor a rising 10th grader in your department for 10-15 hours per week for 6 weeks in July and August.



## STUDENT SUCCESS JOBS PROGRAM

Mentor a high school student (10th-12th grader) as part of SSJP. Students work 7-10 hrs per week after school.



## SSJP SUMMER COLLEGE

Mentor a college student for 10 weeks from June to August @ 35 hours per week. All students are graduates of SSJP's high school program.



## OBSERVATION

Host a SSJP student for a 1 day shadowing / observation. A great option for departments that do not have the capacity for long term mentorship.

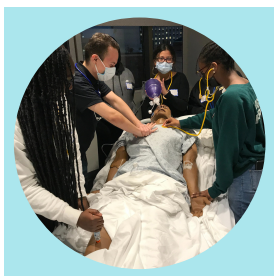

## ABOUT US!

SSJP was established in 2001 in the **Center for Community Health and Health Equity** and has grown significantly over the years. Each year we recruit high school interns from diverse student populations that are underrepresented in health and science careers. Students are selected from seven Boston Public Schools and are motivated by an interest in careers in healthcare and science.

Beginning in Project TEACH, students are matched with BWB mentors who offer authentic work experiences, exposure to career paths, and an understanding of how their profession contributes to the mission of BWB and the advancement of science and medical care. SSJP students are onboarded as Brigham employees and paid through CCHHE. Through BWB's commitment to our community, participating students also receive tutoring in math and science, SAT courses, college guidance, scholarship eligibility and social supports.

## OUR GOALS

01

Provide valuable clinical, public health, and health equity education opportunities as well as exposure to careers in health for high school and college students.

02

Support employment and training opportunities in communities that have experienced historical disinvestment and structural racism

03

Increase the diversity of the healthcare workforce and contribute to building a diverse workforce that is reflective of Mass General Brigham patients and communities.

04

Encourage leadership opportunities through student-led groups such as the Student Committee, Youth Equity Group and Mental Health Mondays.
