

Geraldine S. Pinkus Fellowship

The hematopathology fellowship program at Brigham & Women's Hospital is accepting applications for a new named fellowship, the Geraldine S. Pinkus Fellowship, which will begin July 1st. This fellowship will support **one individual per academic year to perform clinical and/or translational research** relevant to the field of hematopathology based within the Department of Pathology at Brigham & Women's Hospital. Qualified fellows may also have limited clinical, diagnostic responsibilities within the Division of Hematopathology. Applicants must have anatomic and/or clinical pathology training in an ACGME accredited program and either successfully completed or accepted into an accredited Fellowship program in Hematology (pathology).

Applicants with experience in either basic or translational research are preferred. An individual accepted into the program is expected to identify a mentor and define a research project prior to the start of the fellowship year, and to devote 90% of their time to research. The Fellow also is expected to attend weekly clinical conferences of the Division of Hematopathology and relevant conferences of the Center for Advanced Molecular Diagnostics (CAMD) and to contribute to the teaching mission of the Department.

Pinkus Fellows are expected to complete and publish one or more projects over the course of the Fellowship, and use the research experience as a basis for beginning an academic career in hematopathology.
