Hospital and Pharmacy Department Overview

General Information

The Department of Pharmacy at Brigham and Women's Hospital offers a specialized residency in cardiology pharmacy practice. This one-year program is designed to provide advanced training in the area of cardiovascular pharmacotherapy and research.

Program Fundamentals

The PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in advanced or specialized practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care that improves medication therapy. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency should possess competencies that qualify them for clinical pharmacist and/or faculty positions and position them to be eligible for attainment of board certification in the specialized practice area (when board certification for the practice area exists).

Prerequisites and Licensure

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an accredited school or college of pharmacy
- Completion of an ASHP-accredited PGY-1 pharmacy practice residency
- Massachusetts pharmacist licensure required within 120 days of residency start date
- US citizenship or permanent resident visa

Application Information

- Curriculum vitae, letter of intent, recommendation letters due by January 1st
 - All applications and documents should be submitted via Phorcas
- On-site or virtual interviews by invitation only

Program Structure

The BWH residency programs are all one-year programs that provide diverse rotations in many areas of specialization and offer experience in the provision of adult patient-centered care. The scheduling of resident rotations includes a combination of required and elective rotations to ensure that the resident is exposed to a variety of patient populations, medications, disease states, range of complexity, and interdisciplinary team members.

All external PGY2 residents will complete a six-week required orientation learning experience with the Brigham and Women's Pharmacy Department. This introductory training experience will prepare the resident to perform the job functions as required as a pharmacist in the department. This will also serve to provide administrative insights into the provision of pharmacy services within the hospital and to contribute to perspectives for subsequent participation in clinical and/or administrative project activities. All early commit PGY2 residents will undergo an orientation to the PGY2 program outlining expectations, program structure, and responsibilities.

PGY2 Cardiology residents must complete the required learning experiences below. For PGY2 residents, the eleven (11) learning experiences listed below comprise the required residency experiences for the program. External residents will be provided 4 weeks of elective time in which they may experience one 4-week rotation. Early commit residents will be provided 8 weeks of elective time in which they may experience two 4-week elective experiences (unless otherwise discussed with the RPD/residency coordinator). All required and elective learning experiences are listed below. Some elective experiences may be for shorter time periods depending on the resident schedule, rotation availability, and the ability for assigned objectives to be addressed in the defined period. 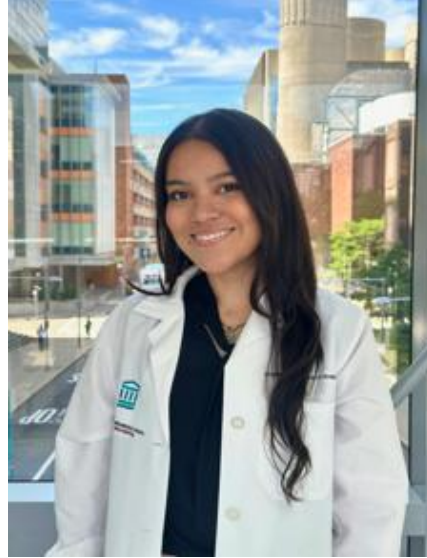
Requirements for Completion of the PGY2 Cardiology Residency Program

- Licensed as a practicing pharmacist in the state of Massachusetts within 120 days of residency start date
- Completion of all required rotation learning experiences
 - Orientation
 - Coronary Care ICU
 - Cardiac Surgery ICU
 - General Cardiology
 - Heart Failure
 - Hemostasis and Antithrombotic Stewardship (HAT)
 - Ambulatory Anticoagulation Management Service
 - Heart Transplant
 - Ambulatory Cardiology Clinic
 - Advanced Integrated Clinical Pharmacy Practice
 - Electrophysiology
- Completion of all longitudinal learning experiences
 - Research Project
 - Committee Membership
 - Pharmacy Departmental Contributions, Formal Presentations and Staffing
- Completion of 1 (external residents) or 2 (internal residents) elective learning experiences
- Document the completion of all assigned disease states in the resident topic discussion spreadsheet
- Reached 80% Achieved for Residency with objectives in Pharmacademic
 - The following objectives are required to be achieved for residency:
 - R1.1.1, R1.1.2, R1.1.3, R1.1.4, R1.1.5, R1.1.6, R1.2.1, R 2.1.1, R2.1.2, R2.2.6, R2.2.7, R3.1.1, R3.2.2, R4.1.2, R5.1.1
- Completion of formal presentation and departmental contributions
 - At least one written guideline (e.g. clinical guideline, drug monograph) approved by all appropriate committee(s)
 - Completion of one ACPE-accredited continuing education program during heart week
 - At least 5 departmental or multi-disciplinary presentations
 - Completion of Anticoagulation Management in Orthopedic Surgery (AMMO) and Aminoglycoside Monitoring Program
- Completion of research project
 - Resident poster presented at ACC scientific sessions or other national conference
 - Manuscript draft for publication
- Completion of professional practice requirements
 - Completion of Advanced Integrated Clinical Pharmacy Practice and weekend staffing requirements
 - Documentation of moonlighting and duty hours as appropriate in PharmAcademic
- Completion of all required documentation
 - Initial ASHP assessment
 - Quarterly self-assessments as part of the Resident Development Plan
 - All learning experience and preceptor and learning experience evaluations
 - Final assessment of residency and feedback
 - Completion of electronic residency binder with upload into the cardiology residency folder
- Obtain both Basic Life Support and Advanced Cardiac Life Support certifications

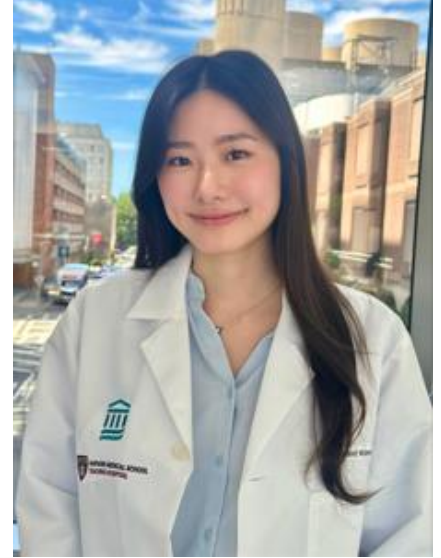
