

Outpatient BWH NICU Follow-up Program

The NICU Follow-up Program at Brigham and Women's Hospital provides a comprehensive team-based approach to the care of children at risk for developmental delay or ongoing medical problems. We regularly assess and support a child's developmental progress as well as provide guidance about:

- * ongoing medical conditions
- * growth and nutrition
- * feeding difficulties
- * parental mental health

Our Multidisciplinary Team includes the following providers:

- * neonatologist
- * clinical psychologist
- * nutritionist
- * physical therapist
- * feeding therapist
- * practice assistant
- * psychiatry and social work available as needed



We Evaluate and Treat infants and children with a range of conditions, including:

- * Prematurity (born at < 32 weeks' gestation or birth weight < 1500 grams (~3.3 pounds))
- * Growth, feeding or swallowing difficulties
- * Cardiopulmonary conditions (chronic lung disease/ bronchopulmonary dysplasia)
- * Neurologic conditions (intracranial hemorrhage, seizures, stroke, meningitis, or after cooling)
- * Congenital anomalies or congenital infections
- * Neonatal abstinence syndrome
- * Other complex medical, surgical, or developmental conditions



Your Child's Visit includes a medical and neurodevelopmental evaluation. Depending on your child's age and needs, evaluations by other team members may also occur. The team will provide you with appropriate feedback and suggested ways to best support and enhance your child's development.
