Typically, the NG tube can be replaced by the clinic nurses M-F, 8am-4PM. Call to schedule a same day visit and ask to speak directly to a nurse.</li> <li>After hours, on weekends and holidays, page the GI fellow on call at 617-355-6000 to find out where and how to have the NG tube replaced.</li> <li>Primary care provider (PCP) will replace the tube.
